Speaker Bio: Everett Bass, Vice President, Public Sector Services, Waste Management Inc.

2000 – Present: Waste Management Inc., Vice President-Public Sector Services Responsibilities include developing and implementing the Public Sector Services strategies for the Company. Also, monitors the activities of 250 Public Sector Services Representatives throughout the United States and Canada. Waste Management currently services approximately 25 million residential customers, representing roughly 30 percent of the Company's total revenue of \$12 billion. Public Sector contracts comprise approximately 80 percent of all residential business.

1993 – 2000: City of Houston, Texas, Director of Solid Waste Management Department Administered a \$54 million budget and a staff of 595. Areas of responsibilities included solid waste collection / disposal and recycling collection / processing.

1992 – 1993: City of Houston, Texas, Director of Public Works Department Administered a \$137 million budget and a staff of 1700 employees. Areas of responsibilities included Solid Waste Management and Recycling, Right-of-Way Maintenance, Traffic and Transportation, Facilities Management and Fleet Maintenance.

1987 – 1992: City of Tampa, Florida, Director of Solid Waste Management Department Administered a \$42 million budget and staff of 200. Areas of responsibilities included solid waste collection and disposal and recycling collection and processing.
