State of The Industry: The Mile-High View. The solid waste and recycling industry faces unprecedented challenges from multiple, dynamic issues; this session will address some of the most important issues facing municipalities today and into the future, as well as potential solutions for these issues, and identify key areas of concern. Key topics to be discussed will include framing a path forward for municipalities with zero waste or high recycling goals; emerging challenges with contracting for services; and what to expect from the next generation of customers and rate payers.

State of Recycling In the Wake of COVID I: Combatting Curbside Contamination/Composition Transition. COVID (yup, COVID, again) has meant more residents at home, and more recyclables in the bins, and more contamination too. It's also in many communities meant a change in what recyclables end up in the bin. In this session, we'll talk about the changing quality, quantity and composition of recyclables collected curbside, the challenges that these changes have presented to communities, and strategies for addressing them.

This session will focus on the next stop in the (re)cycle(ing): the materials recovery facility, or MRF. MRF operators have taken advantage of the latest technology advancements to clean up, so to speak, the materials recovery process. In this session we'll hear about two partnerships – between cities and their MRF/providers – that have resulted in not only a cleaner stream of commodities but cost-savings in the process.

COVID has heightened worker shortages; this impacts not only the availability of the human resources we need to ensure delivery of solid waste services, but the equipment we need as well. In this session leading truck manufacturers will provide an update on the situation and highlight new technologies they're installing on their trucks that will make them safer to operate – in the wake of COVID and in general.
