The 91st Winter Meeting of The United States Conference of Mayors is being developed around the following areas:

1. Under the leadership of Conference President Miami Mayor Francis X. Suarez, key priorities to be discussed will include - but not be limited to - mental health, public safety, technology and innovation, infrastructure, achieving functional zero homelessness, and jobs.
2. Direct engagement with many high-level White House and Department/Agency officials; Congressional leaders, and other policy and thought leaders.
3. Legislative priorities for the new 118th Congress.
4. Implementation of historic legislation passed by the 117th Congress and signed into law by President Biden:
 - The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) — \$65.1 Billion for ALL Cities and NEW Flexibility Bill
 - The Bipartisan Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) — \$1.2 Trillion over 10 Years
 - The Bipartisan CHIPS and Science Act
 - The Bipartisan Safer Communities Act
 - The Inflation Reduction Act (which includes key USCM priorities related to climate change and health care affordability and access)
 - The Bipartisan Fiscal Year 2023 Omnibus Appropriations Act.
5. On Tuesday, January 17 there will be a Special Session open to all mayors and USCM Workforce Development Council (WDC) members only focused on “Mental Health for a Strong Workforce.”
6. There will be a Punchbowl News’ Pop-Up Conversation at The U.S. Conference of Mayors’ 91st Winter Meeting on Tuesday, January 17 from 5:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. open to all meeting attendees.
7. On Wednesday, January 18, from 5:00 p.m. to 6:15 p.m. there will be a Mayors-Only Session on a topic TBA.

The United States Department of Energy and the United States Department of Interior and its Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM) are pursuing an aggressive build-out of wind power to address climate change and sustainability challenges. “The President set a bold goal of deploying 30 gigawatts (GW) of offshore wind by 2030, enough to power 10 million homes with clean energy, support 77,000 jobs, and spur private investment up and down the supply chain.” BOEM recently announced auction winners for five new offshore leasing sites off the coast of California, and marks the first commercial offshore leasing sites to be sold outside of the Atlantic. Other major auctions are planned for the Gulf of Mexico, Oregon Coast, Central Atlantic, and Gulf of Maine.
