Resolution and Committee Deadline

The deadline for submission of proposed resolutions by member mayors was Wednesday, May 3 at 5:00 pm ET. This was the same deadline for standing committee membership changes.

Voting

Only member mayors of a standing committee are eligible to vote on resolutions before that standing committee. Mayors who wish to record a no vote in a standing committee or the business session should do so within the mobile app.

Business Session Voting Credentials

Voting Credentials will be available for the Monday Business Session Vote at the Conference Registration Desk, beginning at 7:00 a.m. on Sunday, June 4.

It will be necessary for all Official Delegates who wish to vote to have these credentials in their possession. There is but one credential for each member city. If the mayor of a member city is registered, the credential will be issued to him or her. If the mayor is not registered and has not been in attendance at the Annual Conference, a registered official from their city must have been designated, in advance, in writing, to be the Official Delegate to receive the city's credentials.

If a registered Member Mayor anticipates that they will not be present at the Business Session, they may designate an alternate, who must be a registered official from their city, to pick up the city's voting credential and exercise the city's vote on Sunday morning. Such an alternate, however, cannot have the floor to speak to any issue under discussion.

The appropriate form for designating an alternate may be filled out at the Registration Desk from 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. on Sunday, June 4 and prior to the Business Session on Monday, June 5.






Meeting Location Maps







The 91st Annual Meeting of The United States Conference of Mayors is being developed around the following areas:

- 1. Priorities identified by the 80th President of The United States Conference of Mayors Miami Mayor Francis X. Suarez including public safety, technology, innovation, achieving "functional zero" homelessness, climate resiliency, and more.
- 2. A major focus on the mental health crisis in America's cities under the leadership of Vice President and Mental Health Task Force Chair Mayor Hillary Schieve of Reno.
- 3. Engagement with high-level Biden Administration officials, Congressional leaders, as well as other key policy and thought leaders.
- 4. A Mayors-Only Discussion on Friday afternoon.
- 5. A focus on how state legislatures are preempting city authority and imposing policies that conflict with the wishes of city residents.
- 6. Strategies and actions needed to reduce the scourge of gun violence occurring daily on our streets and in endless mass shootings.
- 7. Continued implementation of historic legislation passed by the 117th Congress and signed into law by President Biden:
 - The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) \$65.1 Billion for ALL Cities and New Flexibility
 - \circ The Bipartisan Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) \$1.2 Trillion over 10 Years
 - The Bipartisan CHIPS and Science Act
 - The Bipartisan Safer Communities Act
 - The Inflation Reduction Act (which includes key USCM priorities related to climate change and health care affordability and access)
 - The Bipartisan Fiscal Year 2023 Omnibus Appropriations Act.
- 8. Numerous opportunities for direct mayor-to-mayor engagement on a wide range of topics impacting cities of all sizes and in all regions of our Nation, and the sharing of best practices and innovative projects among mayors.
- 9. The consideration, debate, and adoption of policy resolutions submitted by member mayors. This will occur during the meetings of the 11 policy Standing Committees on Friday, June 2 and Saturday, June 3, and then during the official Annual Business Session on Monday morning, June 5.
- 10. The inauguration of Mayor Schieve as the 81st President of The United States Conference of Mayors during a special luncheon on Monday, June 5.
- 11. Networking opportunities with USCM Platinum Partners and Mayors Business Council Members.
- 12. Evening events arranged by Second Vice President Mayor Andrew J.
