





Packaging is now 70% of Seattle's Recycling, Plastics have increased nearly 400% since 2000

Benefits of EPR for Packaging

- ✓ Shifts costs to ease burden on local govs.
- Ensures recycling service for all residents.
- ✓ Reduces resident confusion, enables consistent messaging.
- Creates feedback loop for packaging design and recyclability.
- ✓ Supports local recycling infrastructure development and jobs.
- Creates markets for recycled materials.
- Provides transparency, accountability to ensure responsible recycling.



Recycling Reform Act 2025 – what happens now?



- Start rulemaking
- Prelim. studies & needs assessment
- Establish statewide lists by Oct 1, 2026



ADVISORY COUNCIL

- Appointed by Jan 1, 2026
- Involvement on rules, lists, studies, etc.



SERVICE PROVIDERS

(incl. local govs)

- Must register annually with ECY
- First deadline:Jan 31, 2026
- Align with statewide list and standards



PRODUCER S

- Select PRO by Jan 2026
 - Report on sales & pay fees yearly by July 1



PRO

- Register by March 2026
- Pay state costs starting Sep
 2026, pay service costs starting 2030
